









Did you know how to access the e-Learning assignments, materials, and videos that your teacher posted?









Do these statements apply to your child(ren)?




Student Reasons for Joining Live e-Learning Sessions

Preferred e-Learning Model According to Families








How do you believe these statements apply to your grade-level team or subject-area team?



e-Learning Professional Support According to Teachers


Overall, I believe the District responded sharply by providing me with the tools and professional support needed to transition quickly to e-Learning with my students.



Academic & Social-Emotional Support at School According to Families


Since September, overall, I believe the school-based adults support and encourage my child(ren)'s academic growth.






Level of Understanding & Comfort Connecting with School for Families

Regarding academics, if I need help for/with my child(ren):


Regarding social-emotional development, if I need help for/with my child(ren):

Key Take-Aways

- ★ Faculty and families need **clear communication and assurance** of health and safety procedures and protocols, as well as continued connections with school personnel.
- ★ Health and safety measures, including cleaning procedures and PPE provisions, must align with state and local guidelines.
- ★ For e-Learning, **more synchronous student learning** blended with asynchronous instruction is preferred.
- ★ Ongoing professional development is needed to strengthen online teaching strategies.
- ★ Wrap-around wellness support will benefit students and staff.

First Draft of Re-Opening Plan

Use Your Voice Matters survey data and State Guidelines to create draft. Meet with both staffs, Board, health department for input. Share highlights with community.

Second Draft of Re-Opening Plan

Revise and adjust Plan to reflect input and to accommodate updates to guidelines. Meet with both staffs and Board. Share additional highlights with community.

Finalize & Publish Re-Opening Plan

Share finalized Plan, with the understanding that adjustments will be made if guidance changes.
